

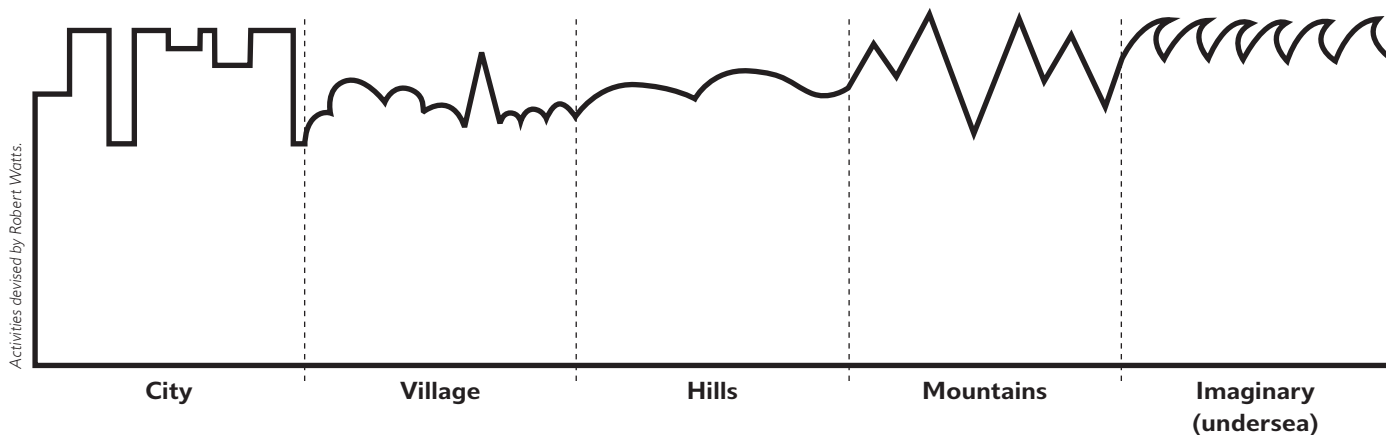
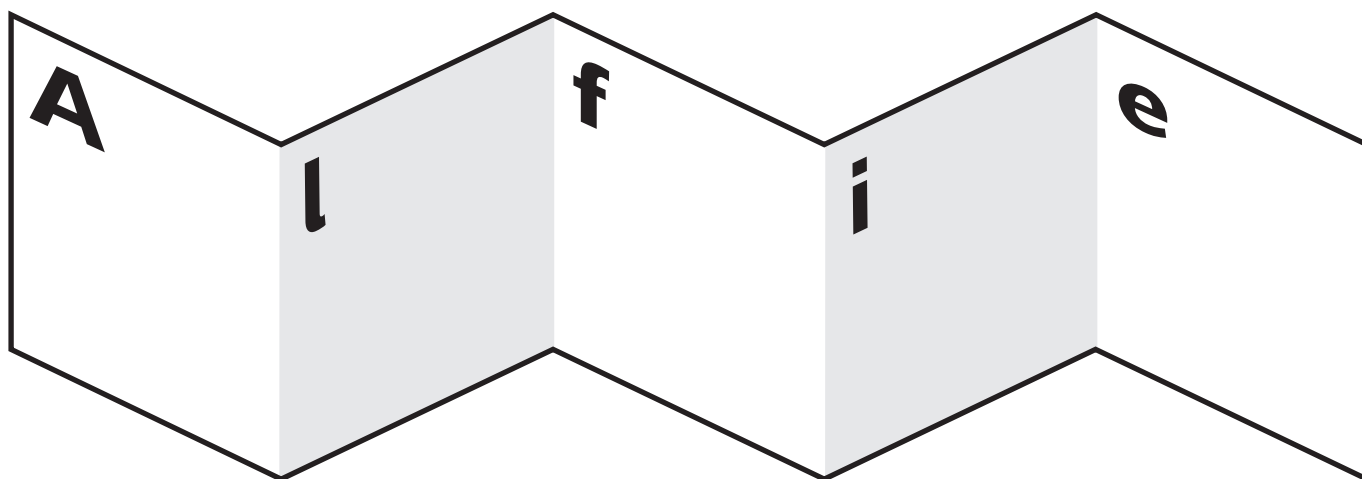
# Zig-zag book

- Prepare a selection of pre-cut strips of card – 30cm or 60cm are good lengths as these can easily be divided equally into four, five or six sections (one for each letter in a child's name).
- Show the class how to fold the card into

zig-zags. On each page, the children can make an illustration inspired by each letter of their name.

- As an extension activity, the pages of the zig-zag book can easily be shaped to match the skylines of your local area

– trees, hills and buildings – or of an imaginary landscape such as the sea (see example below). This structure can be the starting point for children's writing, as the skylines provide the backdrop to an exciting adventure story.
