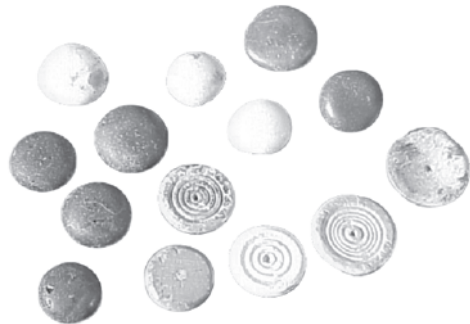


The Expert's Opinion (2)

e

- The smaller artefact is made of lead, and the larger one of bone – it has been restored. They are both cuboids.
- The smaller artefact measures just over 1cm in each direction, the larger one measures just over 1.5cm in each direction.
- The cuboids are marked like dice. Opposite sides add up to seven.
- They were used for playing games.

f

- These artefacts are made of bone, glass and stone. They are round and quite flat in shape.
- The larger pieces near the bottom right are about 2cm in diameter (across).
- Some of the bone pieces have been decorated with grooves.
- These are gaming pieces and were probably used on a board.

h

- This artefact is made of baked clay. Not all of the fragments survived. Those that have been found were pieced together.
- The rim of the amphora measures 10cm in diameter, and each handle is 17cm long.
- The surviving parts of the amphora are undecorated.
- This amphora was probably made in central Italy to hold wine.

g

- This bowl is made of baked clay.
- It measures 23cm in diameter (across) and is just over 9cm tall.
- There is a repeating geometric pattern about half way down the bowl. Under this are images of eagles.
- This might have been used as fine tableware.
