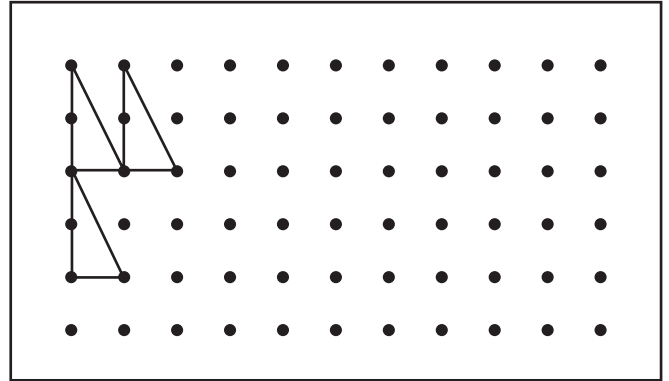
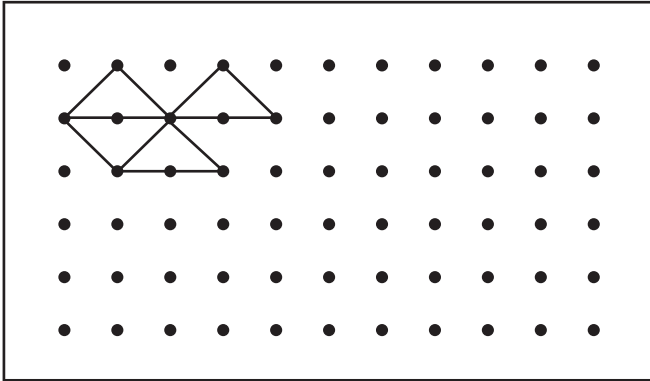


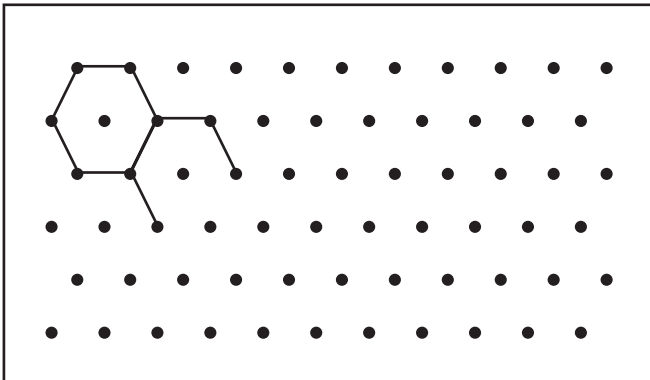
# Tile patterns

These tiles are made from triangles, hexagons and diamonds. Continue the patterns.

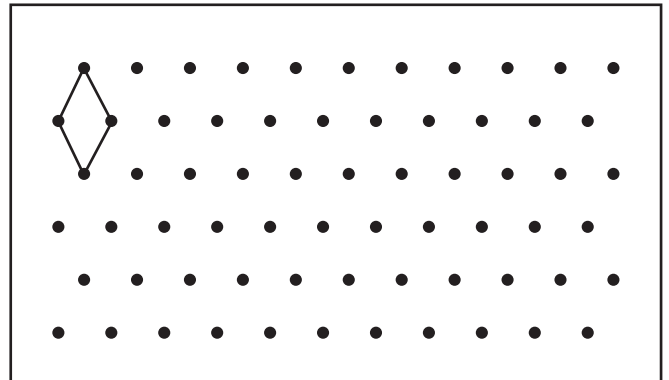
## Triangles



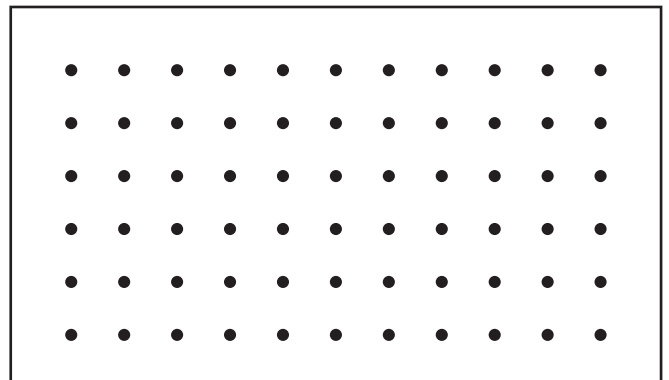
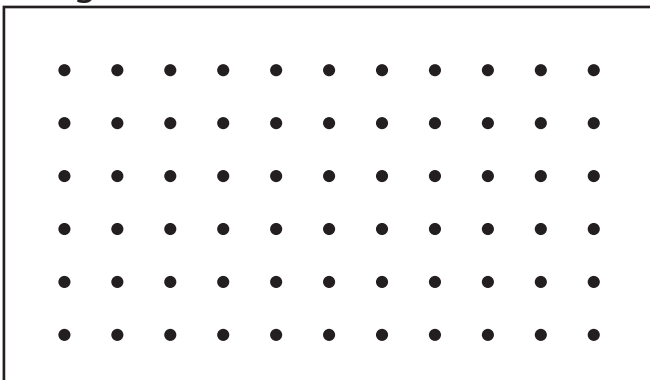
## Hexagons

Design two tile patterns yourself. You could try more triangles, rectangles or even octagons.



### Teachers' notes

**Learning objective:** recognise and continue a repeating pattern.

Talk about the shapes that begin each pattern and ask the children to use the dots to continue each one. Encourage them to notice that the same shape turned upside-down sometimes fills the gap between shapes, and that two triangles may fit together to make a rectangle or a diamond.
