The Spanish Armada



Medium: Did the English fleet attack the Armada from in front or behind?

Behind

Hard: Was the Battle of Gravelines in 1588 a success or failure for the Spanish?

Failure

Easy: What colour was Elizabeth I's hair?

Brown, **red** or black



Medium: What did ladies wear on their faces?

Lead, paint or pencil

Hard: Did boys wear dresses or breeches before they were seven years old?

Dresses

Easy: What happened to Mary Queen of Scots in 1587?

She was beheaded



Medium: Which other country had Mary Queen of Scots once reigned in?

France

Hard: Was Mary Queen of Scots Elizabeth's sister, aunt or cousin?

Cousin

Easy: Did Tudor people drink tea and coffee?

No



Medium: Who ate white bread?

Poor people or **rich people**

Hard: What was 'marchpane'?

Marzipan, cake or biscuit

Easy: When did performances at the Globe take place?

Daytime or night-time



Medium: Was there any cover over the theatre pit?

No

Hard: Which two things happened to let people know that a play was about to start at the Globe?
A bell was rung, a cannon was fired, **a flag was raised or a trumpet would sound**

Easy: Where did Elizabeth I hold her court?

Westminster, Holborn or Stratford



Medium: What was a 'stomacher'?

A dress, **an ornamental panel worn over the chest** or a type of hat

Hard: What did Elizabeth I do at Tilbury in 1588?

Made a speech, did a dance or fought with the Spanish
