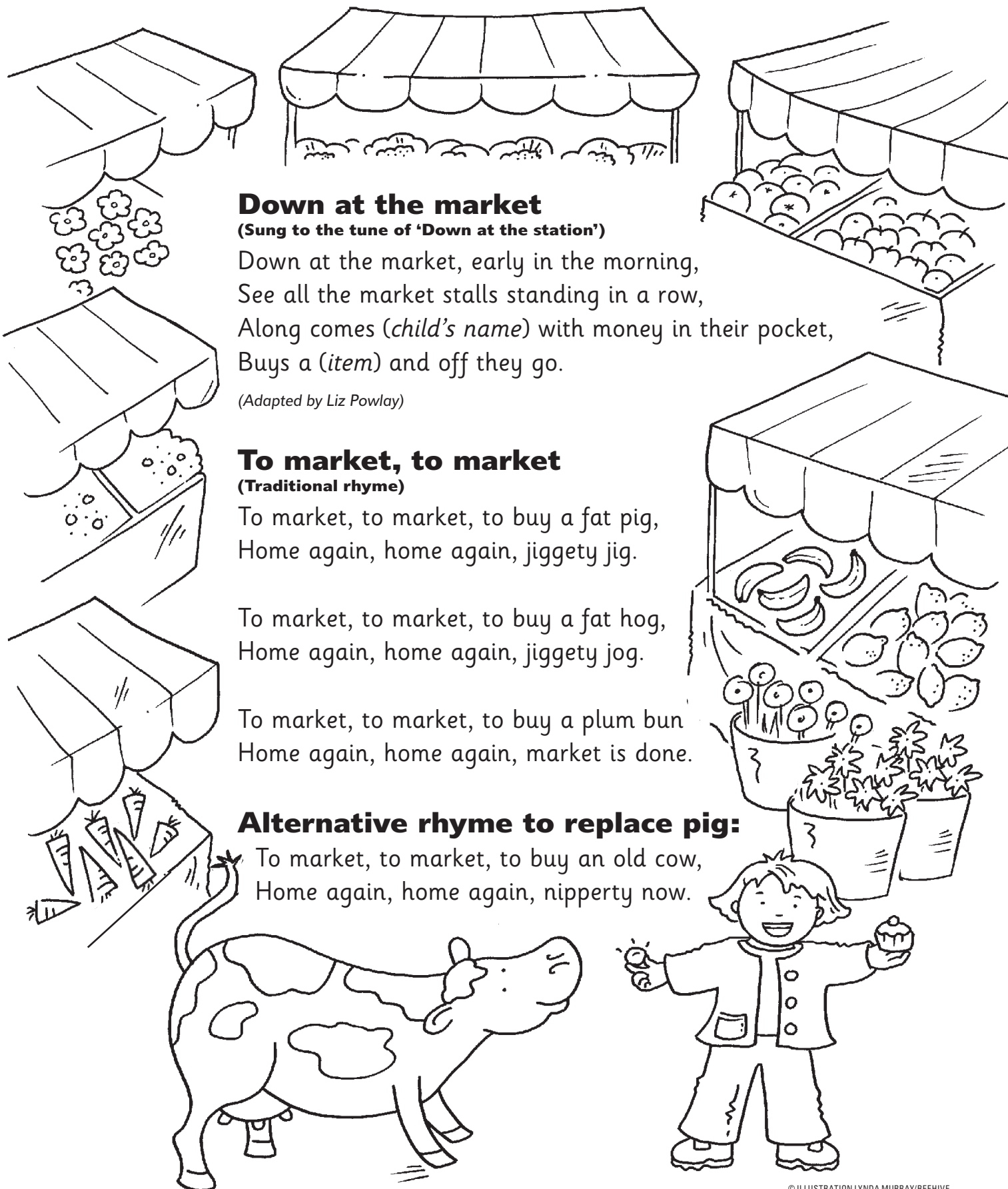


Market rhymes
